Betti Marenko is a transdisciplinary theorist, academic, educator and consultant working across process philosophies, design studies and critical technologies. Her work investigates the relationships between design, society, media and culture, and their role in shaping futures. She is the author of numerous articles, book chapters and essays; regularly invited world-wide to speak on issues of design, futures, and technology, and is the former Associate Editor of the journal *Design and Culture*. Her new book *The Power of Maybes. Machines, Uncertainty and Design Futures* (Bloomsbury) is published in 2025. She co-edited two volumes: *Deleuze and Design* (2015) - the first book to use Deleuze and Guattari to provide a new theoretical framework to address the theory and practice of design; and *Designing Smart Objects in Everyday life. Intelligences, Agencies, Ecologies* (2021). She is the founder and director of *Hybrid Futures Lab*, a transversal research initiative developing speculative-pragmatic interventions at the intersection of philosophy, design, technology and future-crafting practices. She is Reader in Design and Techno-Digital Futures at Central Saint Martins, University of the Arts London and former WRH/WRHI Specially Appointed Professor at Institute of Science Tokyo (former Tokyo Institute of Technology) where she co-founded STADHI (Science & Technology + Art & Design Hybrid Innovation), a transdisciplinary satellite Lab working on developing hybrid methodologies and transversal research practice with a strong engagement in KE activities with industry partners.
